

WORKS NOTIFICATION

PREPARATION FOR LONG-TERM ST KILDA ROAD LANE CLOSURES, DOMAIN JANUARY 2018

Major works on the Metro Tunnel are now underway to support construction of the new Anzac Station which will significantly improve access to the Domain Precinct.

Works will commence from 15 January to prepare for long-term lane closures on St Kilda Road, and the temporary diversion of tram services, road traffic and cyclists around the Anzac Station construction site. In February, St Kilda Road will be reduced to one lane in each direction between Dorcas Street and Toorak Road West, with some access changes to local roads for up to four years while the station is built. These works are subject to relevant approvals.

What works are happening in January 2018?

Work this month will include minor tree pruning ahead of installation of temporary tram power poles along St Kilda Road. Trees will not be removed during this period. Tram pole installation and overhead wiring works will also be carried out at night to prevent disruption to tram services. Road and kerb modification works will also take place on St Kilda Road this month to prepare the area for long-term lane closures in February and future tram service works.

Other works taking place in January include installation of new drainage between St Kilda Road and Bowen Crescent, and work to prepare for the new Park Street tram stop.



15 January - 1 February 2018

St Kilda Road between Government House Drive and Toorak Road West

- · Adjusting medians and kerbs
- Asphalting, installation of traffic barriers and line marking
- · Geotechnical site investigations and soil sampling.

St Kilda Road between Domain Road and Bromby Street

• Tree pruning at the locations of temporary tram power poles.

What to be aware of

- There will be periods of medium to high level noise associated with removing medians and kerbs during the day. This will include saw cutting of the road and kerb
- No trees will be removed as part of these works, however tree pruning is required.

Wher

- 7am 6pm, Monday to Friday
- 7am 5pm, Saturdays.

From 15 January 2018

Bowen Crescent tram stop - Out of service

 The Bowen Crescent Tram Stop (#21) will no longer be operational, in preparation for its removal in February 2018. Passengers who normally use Stop 21 will need to use either Stop 20 Domain Road, or Stop 22 Toorak Road.

Monday evening, 22 January – Friday morning, 26 January 2018

St Kilda Road between Domain Road and Bromby Street

- Works on the existing tram overhead wiring
- Installation of temporary tram power poles on the St Kilda Road southbound lanes.

What to be aware of

- Works will take place at night to prevent disruption to tram services
- These works are expected to generate a medium level of noise.

When

7pm - 6am.

Traffic impacts

- There will be temporary lane closures on St Kilda Road southbound between Domain Road and Bowen Crescent during the day and night. At times vehicles will be required to use the middle carriageway and speed limits will be reduced to 40km/hr
- Domain Road will continue to be closed at the western (St Kilda Road) end, but will remain open from the east
- Traffic management measures will manage the safety of pedestrians, cyclists and work crews.

The timing of these works is subject to change due to weather, ground conditions and other issues. Where there are significant changes to our program, we will notify directly affected community members.
