

WORKS NOTIFICATION

DOMAIN PRECINCT ANZAC STATION CONSTRUCTION WORKS

SEPTEMBER 2018

Works in preparation for major construction of the Metro Tunnel and the new Anzac Station are continuing. The current phase of construction involves major works in the northern section of the station box and reparation works in the southern section of the station box.

Construction snapshot

Construction works are continuing within the St Kilda Road site throughout September and will include:

- · Park Street tram stop finishing works
- St Kilda Road traffic diversion works
- · Ongoing site establishment works
- Northern section station box construction
- Southern section station box construction
- Geotechnical investigations and soil sampling.

Day works

All works in this notification will be performed as day works unless otherwise notified.



When

- 7am 6pm, Monday to Friday
- 7am 1pm, Saturdays.

Potential extended work hours - Concrete pours (Monday - Saturday)

Please note that Diaphragm wall (D-wall) excavation works have now started. Excavated D-wall holes cannot be left open for extended periods of time and must be poured with concrete soon after the reinforcement cage is placed in the excavated hole.

Concrete pours for guide wall and D-wall construction and for piling works must be continuous to ensure structural integrity. Once a concrete pour has started, it must be completed and on occasions this activity may need to continue outside of normal construction hours.

These works are expected to generate low levels of noise and every effort will be made to ensure they are completed within standard work hours.

Night works

16 - 21 September (4 nights)



When

St Kilda Road traffic diversion works:

• 7pm - 6am

Park Street tram stop finishing:

• 2am - 4am







What we are doing

Park Street tram stop finishing works

- Night works are required to install bluestone tiles along the edge of the city bound platform at the Park Street tram stop (stop 20) on St Kilda Road
- These works will take place for approximately two hours each night and include the use of non-motorised hand tools
- These works are expected to generate intermittent periods of low level noise and need to occur at night to avoid disruption to tram services.

When

• 2am - 4am, Sunday 16 September to Friday 21 September 2018.

St Kilda Road traffic diversion works

- Night works are required to undertake traffic barrier adjustments on St Kilda Road between Park Street and Bowen Lane
- These works are expected to generate intermittent periods of medium to high level noise associated with the movement of concrete traffic barriers. Works will involve the use of a small crane to shift barriers, light towers, generators, hammer drills, line marking vehicles, water blasting and line marking
- To undertake these works some traffic diversions will be required. Traffic management will be in place to direct vehicles
- These are only minor adjustments to the road and there will be no changes to traffic arrangements when complete
- These works need to occur at night while traffic volumes are low.

Ongoing site establishment works

Site establishment activities outlined in previous construction updates will continue and include the construction of hard hoarding fencing and galvanised chain mesh fencing around the worksite. Works to install jersey barrier fencing were completed in August. Please refer to the map overleaf for fencing type by location.

Northern section station box construction

Northern section station box construction activities are continuing as previously outlined in the August construction update.

Piling platform and guide wall works are now complete, and the bentonite plant has been commissioned. Diaphragm-wall (D-wall)

construction works commenced in late August and will continue throughout September, these works will form the outer walls of the new Anzac Station.

Southern section station box construction

Piling platform works and obstruction removal in the Southern section station box commenced in July and continued throughout August. The preparation work for the removal of redundant building anchors beneath St Kilda Road is now complete.

Works in September include:

- The removal of redundant ground anchors beneath St Kilda Road in early September as detailed in the August construction notification
- Removal of four trees on the western side of St Kilda Road between Bowen Lane and Albert Road South (see map)
- Construction of guide walls around the southern section of the station
- Construction of a retaining wall on the northern boundary of the station box.

Both northern and southern box construction activities will involve regular deliveries to site and the removal of spoil (dirt).

Geotechnical investigations


- Geotechnical investigations and soil sampling works are continuing in the Domain Precinct to assess ground and environmental conditions
- Existing groundwater monitoring wells may be accessed during September to measure groundwater levels. This will require up to two workers accessing the wells for approximately 10 minutes.

Traffic changes

- The St Kilda Road service lane in front of 400 and 390 St Kilda Road will remain closed until mid to late 2019
- Access for Botanica residents' driveway entrance on St Kilda Road will be maintained via Bowen Crescent
- The road from Bowen Lane to Albert Road will be realigned to allow room for construction of the southern station box construction (see map)
- At times, the road will need to be temporarily closed during the day and cars will need to u-turn at the end of the road. The community will be notified in advance of these closures. Access from Bowen Lane to Albert Road will reopen following these works.

Pedestrian Impacts

- A new footpath diversion will be created within the Shrine Grounds near the MacRobertson Fountain. This is to accommodate the expansion of the construction site in this area. A temporary footpath will be used while construction of the diversion footpath is underway
- A covered pedestrian walkway will be installed outside Melbourne Grammar School near the corner of Domain Road and St Kilda Road.
 The covered walkway is to ensure the safety of pedestrians while the D-wall work is happening adjacent to the footpath. The installation will be undertaken over the weekend and some pedestrian diversions will be in place.

What to be aware of

- There will be periods of loud noise and some vibration associated with non-destructive digging, rock breaking, jack hammering, ground compaction, piling, D-wall and retaining wall construction activities
- · Water carts will be used to manage dust
- All impacts will be managed in accordance with the Metro Tunnel Environmental Performance Requirements.

In order to enhance the liveability of places surrounding construction sites, the Metro Tunnel Creative Program is working with stakeholders to create pockets of respite, creativity, and activation.






Artist impression of pop-up park on Domain Road. Indicative only.
