Dear resident,

We urgently need your help to improve our City's recycling.

With more people at home at the moment, there has been a sharp increase in recycling contamination. This occurs when the wrong items are put in the yellow-lidded bin. It can sometimes be the simplest thing, such as broken window glass, a plastic bag or a chip packet.

Even if you think you're doing the right thing, we urge you to double-check to make sure.

The most common mistakes are:

• bagging recycling in rubbish bags or similar

• garden and food waste.

The cost of contamination

Contamination costs us all: we all know about the negative environmental impact, but there's also huge financial cost to Council and ratepayers alike. If a bin is contaminated, it means there are extra costs to process materials and in some cases all items will be sent to landfill.

We will be conducting ongoing auditing of bins to improve our recycling. If they are found to have high levels of contamination, your collection may not take place.

Here's a reminder. These items **must not** be placed in your yellow-lidded bin:

- household waste/food scraps
- garden waste

- soft plastics and plastic bags
- styrofoam.

These items can be placed in your yellow-lidded bin:

- empty plastic containers and bottles (numbered 1 to 5)
- glass bottles and jars
- paper and cardboard boxes.
